SHOWS

The Branson/Lake Area offers 52 theaters and more than 100 shows with over 60,317 theater seats. Audiences can see shows throughout the day - breakfast shows, matinees and evening performances round out a full day of great entertainment. Country, pop, swing, rock-n-roll, gospel, classical and Broadway-style music and productions join comedy and magic shows to provide visitors a wide array of entertainment choices.

SHOPPING

Branson's newest landmark, Branson Landing, is a \$420 million, 95-acre development along Lake Taneycomo blending more than 100 retail shops with dining, luxury lodging, riverwalk, town square, marinas and nightlife in a dynamic, waterfront setting. Shops at the Landing include the Belk Department Store, Bass Pro Shops, 100 specialty stores, and several restaurants. The area also boasts three exceptional outlet malls.

LAKE ACTIVITIES
